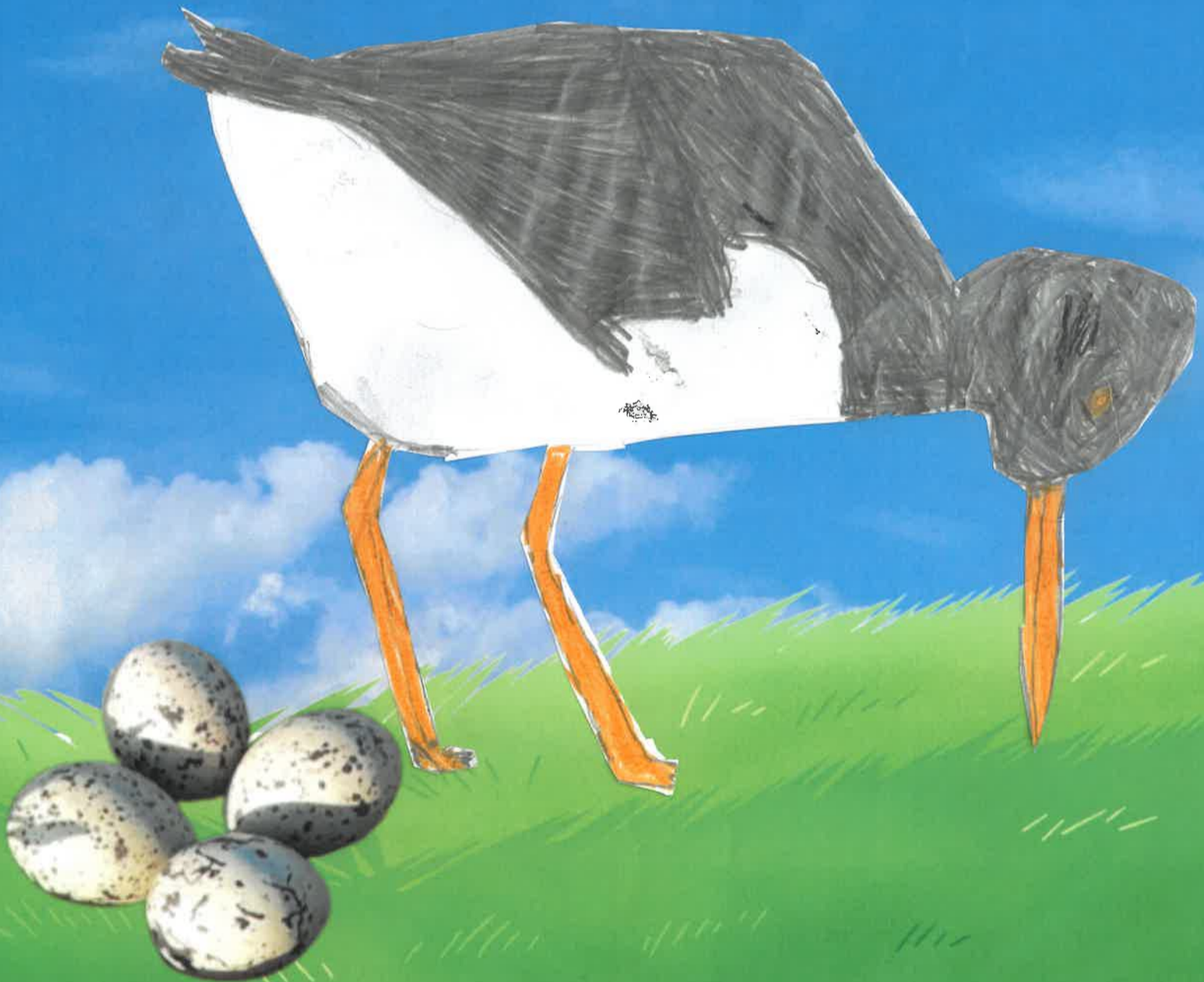

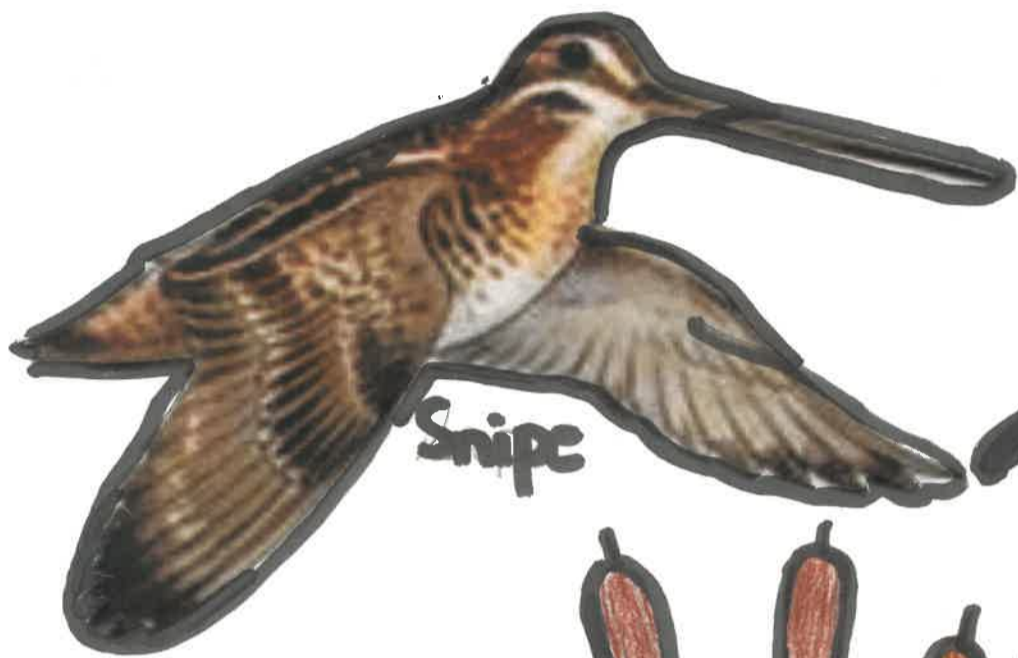

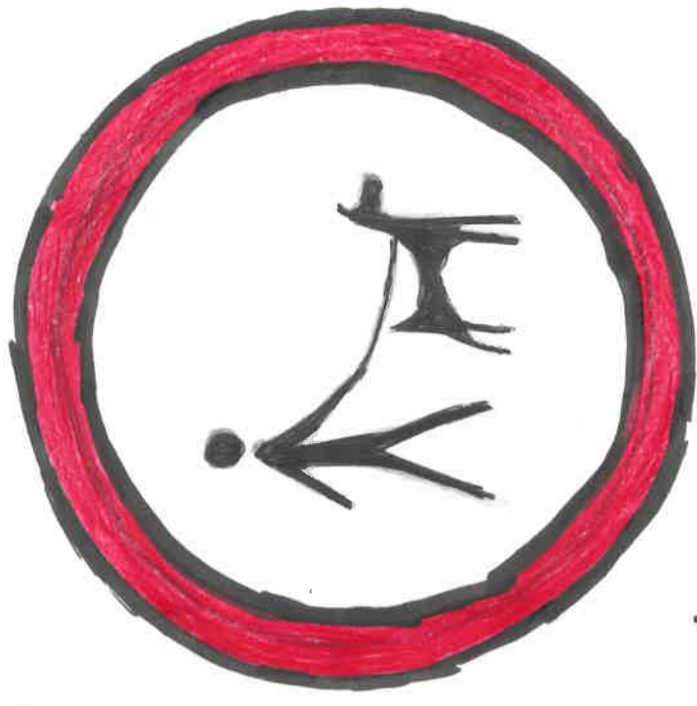


Red-necked Phalarope

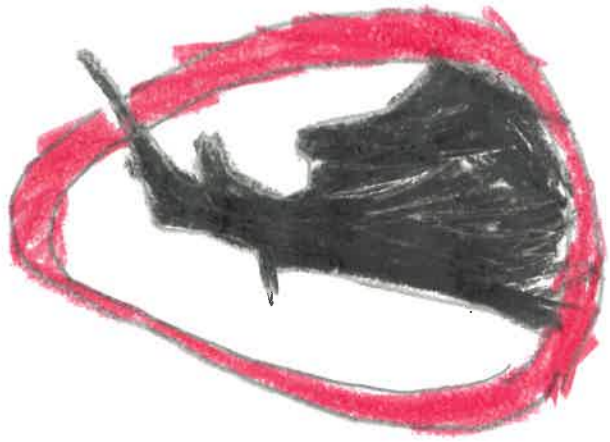

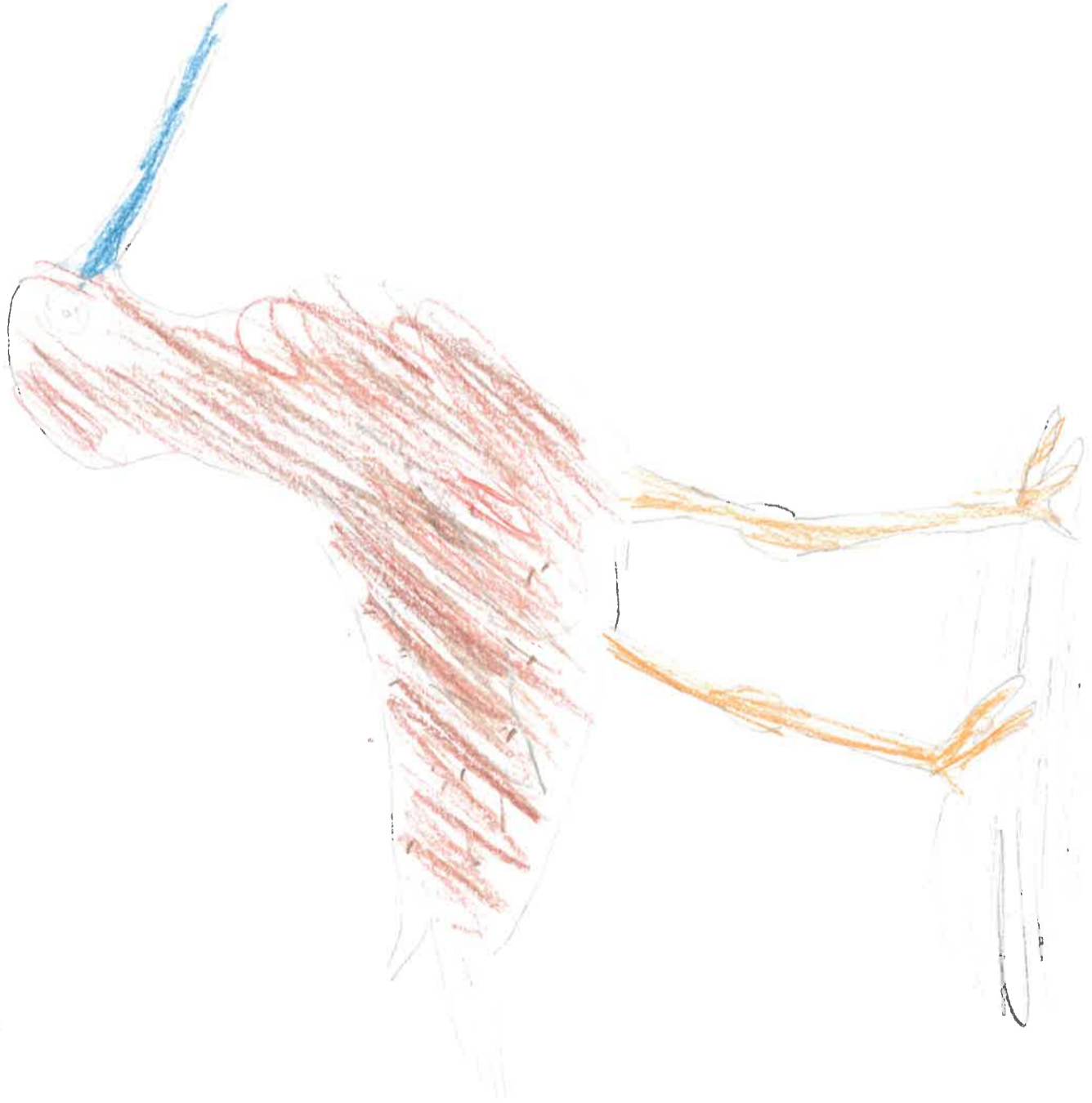

frogs



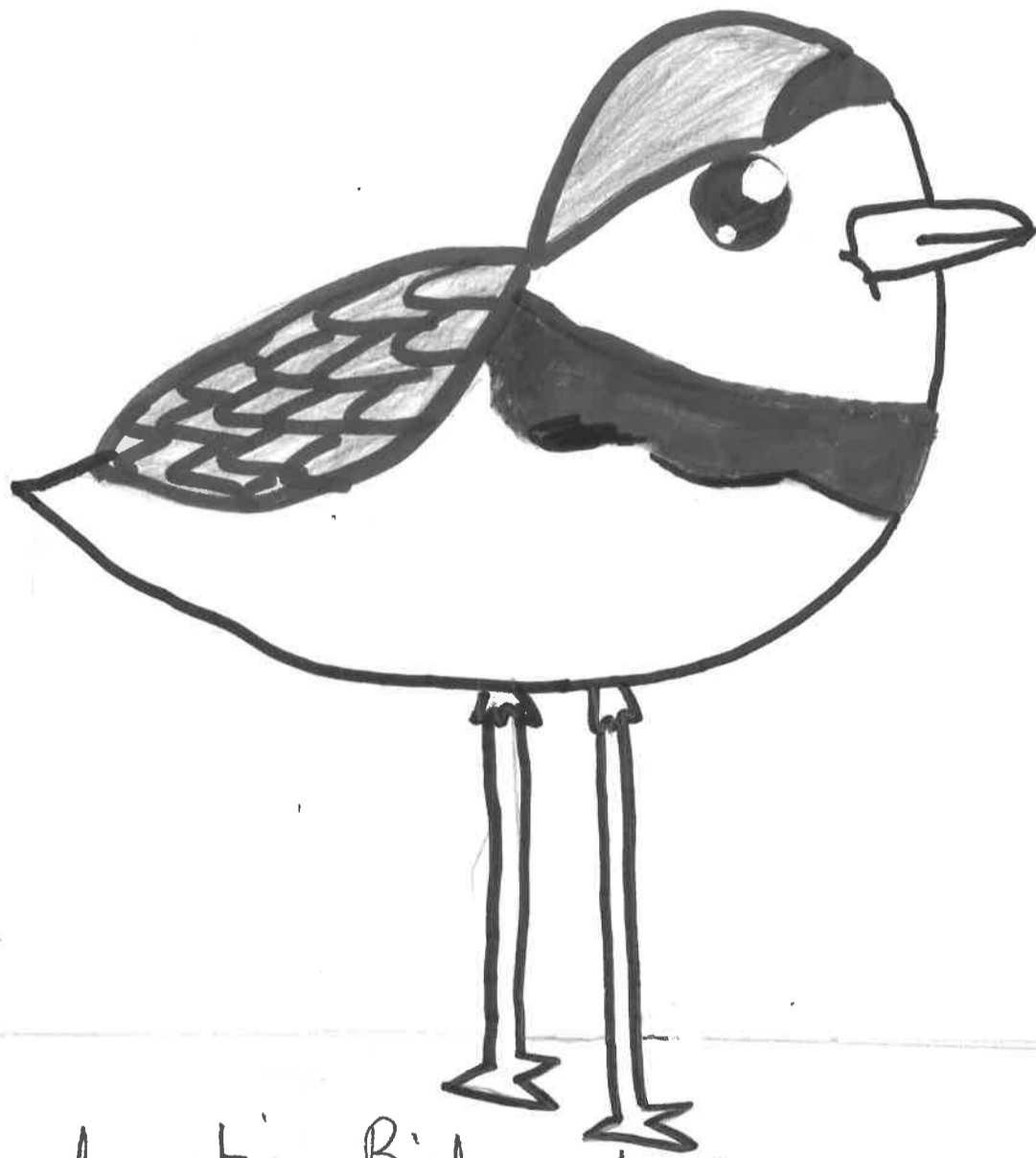
Caution! Waders Nest Here!

Redshank = Anywhere damp

Common Sandpiper = Near freshwater lakes

Oyster catcher = coastal areas

Ringed Plover = Stony areas

Snipe = Moorlands and bogs

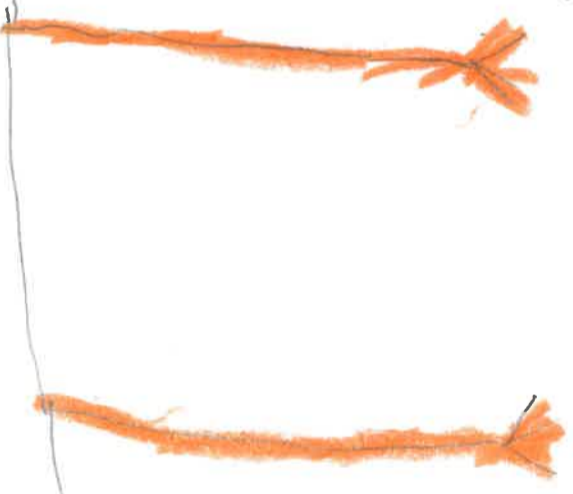


Breeding waders is a company that is set to protect the wader species which is coming to a decline so here is some facts that might help protect them.

Since the 1990's, lapwing numbers in Ireland have dropped by half and the species is now red-listed.




The name lapwing relates to the way they fly.



The national bird of Ireland is the northern lapwing.

The Lapwing or Plover is a distinct iridescent green and white Plover with a long wispy crest and a very short beak and rounded wings.

Lapwings eat insects, snails and other invertebrates.

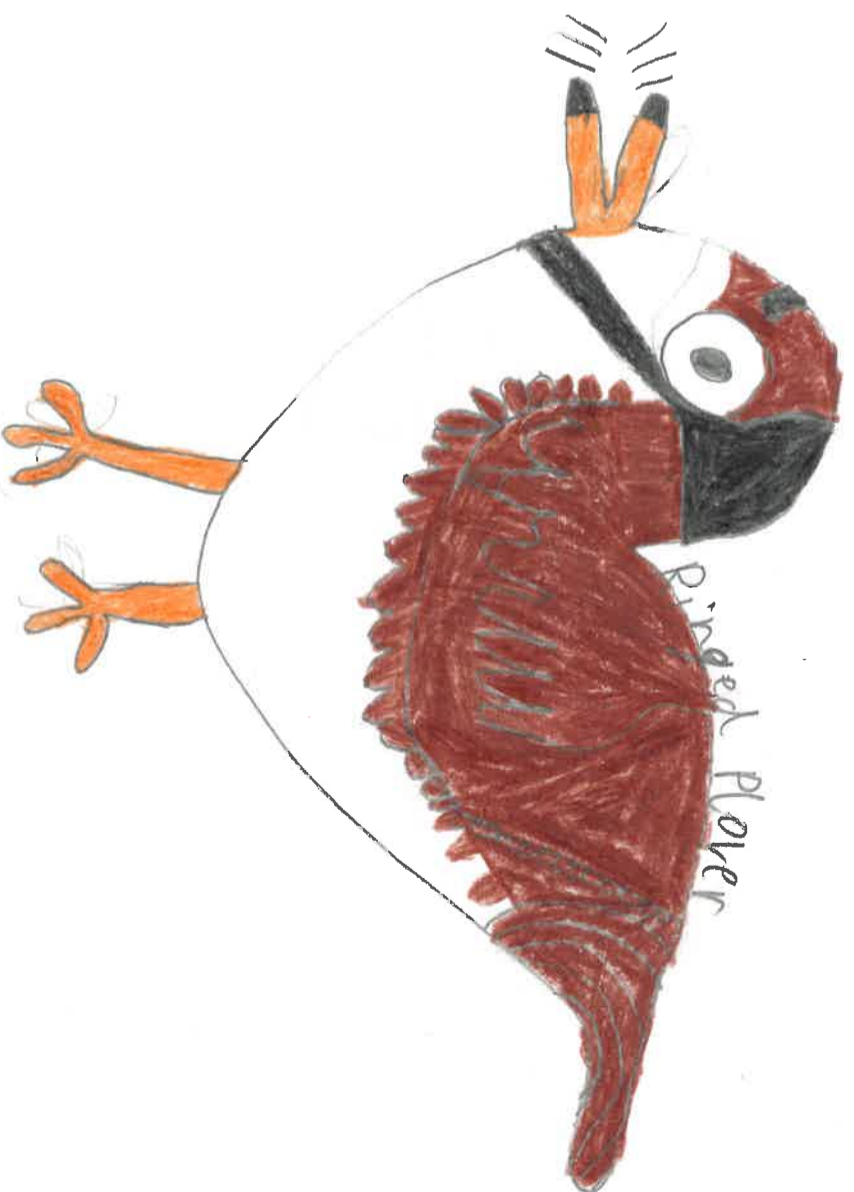




The Lapwing is a distinctive black and white bird with a purple and green back and a beautiful crest at the top of their head.
